In the courthouse at Brownsville, deed book "G", page 371, dated November 25, 1857, we found the following:

Indenture made between John S. Durbin, of the first part, and John N. Durbin, of the second part, both of Edmonson County, Ky., Witnesseth that the said John S. Durbin for the natural affection he has for the said John N. Durbin, and the further consideration of one dollar in hand paid, . . . being a tract of land patented to the said John S. Durbin on the 22nd of January, 1845,

This deed seems to point to John S. Durbin as being the father of John N. I have not found John S. Durbin on any census, and this is the only deed with his name on it. According to marriage records at Brownsville, John N. Durbin was born in Indiana. He first appeared in Edmonson County on the tax list for 1847, and his name was placed between that of Joseph C. Durbin and Christopher N. Durbin.

John N. Durbin, parentage unknown, was married to Mary H., daughter of Silas Z. Simon and Mary Sarah Durbin, in Edmonson County, January 20, 1848. Christopher Durbin was on the marriage bond.

John Will and Elenora lived, in my lifetime, north of Sunfish Creek and south of the Sunfish-Bee Spring Road. John Will owned a small farm, and in the 1930's worked buying land for the Mammoth Cave National Park.

Around the turn of the century, John Will was cutting ties for the railroad. At the time, there was a gang of "night riders" similar to the Ku Klux Klan operating in the Sunfish area, and they wanted some of their men to cut the ties for John Will. He refused to hire them, and when he had a big stack of ties ready for the market, they were burned, along with his barn, during the night.

I can remember John Will sitting on his front porch feeding squirrels. There was a little patch of woods around his house, and the squirrels would come up and climb to John Will's shoulders to be fed. He never allowed anyone to hunt on his property.

John Will died in 1940, and Elenora died in 1960.

Children of John W. Durbin and Elenora French

a. Estill was in the Army during World War I. On his way overseas, he and several others in his Company were stricken with the flu. They were put in the hospital in Hoboken, New Jersey, and soon it was learned that Estill had contracted meningitis.

The Army, or someone, informed John Will of Estill's condition, and John Will boarded a train bound for the hospital in Hoboken. Before he arrived Estill died, and his casket had been sealed to prevent any contamination from the meningitis. When John Will returned with Estill's body, he opened the casket to make sure he had his son.

Estill died October 14, 1918, and is buried at St. John Cemetery, Sunfish.

b. Alonzo was married to June Houtchins, parentage unknown, August 24, 1939. Alonzo built the store on the southeast corner of Ky. 187 and the Bee Spring Road (presently operated by John A. Durbin) and operated it for several years. He and June were divorced after their first son was born, and the son was reared mainly by Angelia, Alonzo's sister.

June was discovered to have a severe case of tuberculosis and spent several months in a sanitarium before she was cured. When she was released she joined the Church, and she and Alonzo were remarried. June was, I believe, a school teacher.

Alonzo and June were the parents of three children:

- aa. David, born September 29, 1940, was married to Betty
 _______, and ran a service station in western Louisville.
 They had two children, Patrick and David Jr. David Sr. was killed in an automobile accident January 6, 1972.
- bb. James Alonzo Jr., born June 22, 1947, was married to Christina Earles. James Alonzo ran a men's store in Leitchfield and an insurance agency. He died at age 38, August 16, 1985.
- cc. C.C. Jack no information.

Alonzo was buried March 4, 1986, at St. John Cemetery, Sunfish.

c. Elmer ("Jack") was married to Tina, daughter of 0.B. French and Idora Lashley, May 30, 1936. There were no children.

Tina was a school teacher, and Jack farmed. Tina was the only teacher who ever whipped me in school, and I'm sure I deserved the spanking. Jack and Tina lived for a number of years in an old log cabin, or house, that sat off the road on the east side, but after I left Sunfish they built themselves a fine brick home on the highway.

Jack and Tina retired to Leitchfield a few years ago, and Jack died there, at age 80 years, September 17, 1985.

d. Mary Alma was married to Thomas Woodrow, son of Scott Shanks and Frances Zonie Durbin, of Graves County, in Louisville, November 23, 1936.

Alma died in 1972, and Thomas died December 3, 1984. His obituary listed his children as: John W., Louis E., James E. and Thomas E.

- e. Angelia was never married. She kept house for several priests, and died March 23, 1984 at age 69.
- f. Marjorie was married to Herbert, son of Martin Robert Durbin and Laura Ellen Higgs, May 5, 1941. (This line will be carried later in this section.)
- g. Laymon died in a fire in January, 1925.
- B. Sarah Ellen, daughter of Silas M. Durbin and Martha E. Bush, was first married as second wife of James Elisha, son of Christopher C. Durbin and Elizabeth Lashley, September 6, 1898.

After the death of James Elisha, Sarah Ellen was married as second wife of Thomas F., son of Francis Lashley and Jemima Durbin, September 26, 1909. (This line will be found in the Christopher Durbin, Jr. Family Section, and in the Lashley Family Section.)

- G. Ann Florence, daughter of Silas M. Durbin and Martha E. Bush, was married to Clarence, son of Squire Olliver Baker and Martha Ann Hunt, August 29, 1909. (This line will be carried in the French Family Section, Squire O. Baker Family.)
- H. Adelaide, daughter of Silas M. Durbin and Martha E. Bush, was married to Martin Joseph, son of John Thomas Logsdon and Kitty Ann Robinson, March 1, 1908. (This line will be carried in the Logsdon Family Section.)
- Joseph B., son of John N. Durbin and Mary H. Simon, was married to Rachael Ellen, 14, daughter of James Robert Durbin and Teresa Ellen Gatton, May 26, 1872.

Joseph B. apparently died shortly after this marriage date, for Rachael Ellen was married second to John Thomas, son of James Hayes and Parmelia Jones, November 12, 1876. (This line will be carried in the Hayes Family Section.)

He and Sarah Ann, and their daughter, Mary Ellen, are believed to be buried at Mineola at the Catholic Cemetery.
