Martin John was a man of big ambitions, according to his grandson, James Nobert Simon, and was always thinking and talking of doing big things to make money. According to James Nobert, Martin's ideas never panned out, and he never did make the big splash. One of Martin's ideas, which ended in tragedy, was to rent some extra land, plant a large corn crop, and to harvest his timber the same year.

After considerable attention to the details, Martin decided he needed to borrow some extra money, and went to the bank in Brownsville to acquire a loan. The bank would not lend the money without a co-signer, so Martin forged Daniel Durbin's name to the application for the loan. Since Daniel Durbin was well known as a man of means, the bank made the loan.

Martin planted his huge crop of corn, and started cutting his timber. The corn crop came up well, but did not develop because of a lack of rain, and in the fall did not produce the expected results. This left Martin far short of the money needed to repay the loan. When the bank started making efforts to collect, they found Martin could not make the payment. Since Daniel Durbin was co-signer, they went to him for the payment. Naturally, Daniel Durbin denied the signature was his, to the satisfaction of the bank. Martin was brought up on charges of forgery, and sentenced to serve a term in the penitentiary.

After Martin's death, Surrilda Jane lived in the same house with Jim Bill, Mary Martha, and Flossie, and Nobert, when he was returned to Sunfish, was reared in this house. Nobert remembers Surrilda well, and told me she was a woman of strong will, and believed the only way to do anything was her way. She had him doing some

gardening chores, and Nobert thought of an easier way to do the work, but she would not allow him to make any changes. He did them his way, and when Surrilda caught him, she raised a big fuss. He tried to tell her he was doing a good job anyway, and Surrilda slapped him in the face, told him to do the job as she directed, and said,

"I didn't take any sass from any of my kids, and I won't take any sass from you either."

Nobert finished up the job her way.

Martin John Simon died December 21, 1924, age 75.

Surrilda J. Bush Simon died January 3, 1936, age 85.

James and Ion lived at Grassland, where they had their family. James owned the house on Whetstone Creek, and Martin John and Surrilda and two daughters, Maude and Tot, lived in this house. Ion and James separated and divorced, and James came back to Sunfish and lived the rest of his life with his two sisters. Both Martin and Surrilda died at Jim Bill's.

There was a high hill behind Jim Bill's house, heavily wooded, and he allowed no hunting. He was particularly fond of the squirrels, and ran everyone out if he caught them hunting. When I was 13 or 14 years old, another young man and I were hunting, and went onto Jim Bill's hill looking for squirrels. The other hunter, being older than I and knowing about the ban on squirrel hunting, led me into trouble. We saw no game, but to shake Jim Bill up a little, he had me to shoot my gun a couple of times. Sure enough, Jim Bill came out of the back of his house and yelled for us to get out of his squirrels. The other boy laughed and told me to tell him to go to hell. I did just that, and we walked on.

It was about one and one-half miles from Jim Bill's house to my father's store. Before I got home, Jim Bill had walked to the store and told Dad about me telling him to go to hell, and although he couldn't be sure it was I who called back to him, he thought it was me. Needless to say, I caught a good one from Dad, and to add insult to injury, he even made me pay for the shotgun shells.
