IX. Robert A., son of John J. Durbin and Patience Logsdon, was married to Elizabeth, probable daughter of Thomas Hill and

Robert A. and family left Sunfish in 1852, and in 1853 were living in Lawrenceville, Illinois. Elizabeth died in Lawrence County in 1855 or 1857, and Robert was married second to Corina Vise (Vize) French, a widow, January 12, 1858. This marriage was performed by Fr. Elisha Durbin, Robert A.'s brother, in Union County, Kentucky. Corina had two children by her first husband, George and Amelia. Corina died February 18, 1861 in Carlyle, Clinton County, Illinois. Robert A. and Corina were the parents of one child, Robert A. Jr., born November 24, 1858.

Robert A. was on the Clinton County, Illinois census in 1860, and was still there in the State census of 1865. After 1865, Robert A.'s movements are unknown. He was married third to Mahalu Dunn, a widow, in Clinton County, December 28, 1861.

Robert A. died January 23, 1892, 79 years, 3 months and 3 days. He would have been born on or about October 20, 1812. He is buried in Calvary Cemetery in Newton, Jasper County, Illinois.

On December 17, 1853, Robert A. Durbin of the County of Lawrence and State of Illinois, sold to James S. Durbin, of Edmonson County, Kentucky, a tract of land for \$175.00.

On May 10, 1854, Robert A. Durbin and wife Eliza, of the County of Lawrence, State of Illinois, sold a tract of land in Edmonson County to John Miller.

My good friend, Robert Ross Durbin of St. Louis, is a descendant of Robert A. Durbin and Elizabeth Hill, through the son Pius A., and his son Leo Douglas Durbin.
